Accessibility Plan

At Our Lady Queen of Peace Catholic Primary School, we are committed to equality. We will:

- Eliminate discrimination, harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is contrary to our belief that each person is unique and special and prohibited by or under Equality Act 2010 and the SEND code of practice 2014.
- Advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it.
- Foster good relations between people who share a protected characteristic and people who do not share it.

With this in mind this Accessibility Plan has been drawn up. We are committed to providing a fully accessible environment which values and includes all pupils, staff, parents and visitors regardless of their age, education, physical, sensory, social, spiritual, emotional and cultural needs. We are committed to challenging negative attitudes about disability and accessibility and to developing a culture of awareness, tolerance and inclusion.

The Accessibility Plan will, over time and in line with changing needs:

- Improve awareness of equality and inclusion.
- Improve access to the physical environment of the school, adding specialist facilities as necessary. This covers improvements to the physical environment of the school and physical aids to access education.
- Increase access to the curriculum for pupils with a disability, expanding the curriculum as necessary to ensure that all pupils, with or without a disability, are prepared for life. This covers teaching and learning and the wider curriculum of the school such as participation in after-school clubs, leisure and cultural activities or school visits. It also covers the provision of specialist aids and equipment, which may assist these pupils in accessing the curriculum.
- Improve the delivery of written information to pupils, staff, parents and visitors with disabilities. Examples might include handouts, timetables, textbooks and information about the school and school events. The information will be made available in various preferred formats within a reasonable time frame.

Aims and objectives

Our aims are:

- that all our children achieve at the highest level possible for each individual;
- to be an inclusive school;
- not to treat disabled pupils less favourable for a reason related to their disability
- to make reasonable adjustments for disabled pupils, so that they are not at a substantial disadvantage
- to plan to increase access to education for disabled pupils.

Disability as defined by the DDA is;

A person has a disability if he or she has a physical or mental impairment that has a substantial and long-term adverse effect on his or her ability to carry out normal day to day activities.

At Our Lady Queen of Peace we have the following provision in place;

- Ramp access into the school
- Reception and KS1 have level access to the lunch hall KS1 yard and toilets.
- Disabled toilet facility for wheelchair use.
- Stairlift quote in place for middle entrance.

The school takes into account the needs of pupils, staff and visitors with physical difficulties and sensory impairments when planning and undertaking future improvements and refurbishments of the site and premises. It is a requirement that the school's accessibility plan is implemented and reviewed as necessary.

This plan compliments our Equality Policy, Disability Equality Scheme, Inclusion Policy, Equal Opportunities policy, Administration of medicines, Safeguarding and Child Protection policies.
